

ABOUT THE MALAYSIAN TECHNICAL COOPERATION PROGRAMME (MTCP)

The Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP) was officially launched on 7 September 1980 at the 2nd Commonwealth Heads of Government Regional Meeting (CHOGRM) in New Delhi, India, to signify Malaysia's commitment to South-South Cooperation, in particular Technical Cooperation among Developing Countries (TCDC). The programme forms part of the commitment of the Malaysian Government towards the promotion of technical cooperation among developing countries, strengthening of regional and sub-regional cooperation, as well as nurturing collective self-reliance among developing countries. Annually, MTCP collaborates with its leading Training Institutions to conduct capacity building programmes in various key areas of development. Since its inception in 1980, more than 32,800 participants from 143 recipient countries have benefited from the various programmes offered under the MTCP.

- To share development experience with other countries;
- To strengthen bilateral relations between Malaysia and other developing countries;
- To promote South-South Cooperation (SSC); and
- To promote technical cooperation among developing countries (TCDC)

APPLICATION

Applications should be made using the prescribed MTCP forms available at

Submitted application forms must be accompanied by the applicant's:

- Copy of Passport
- Passport sized coloured photo (3.5cm x 5cm)
- Medical Report

All application forms must be duly completed and endorsed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs or National Focal/Aid Coordinator Agency in the respective countries (the relevant ministry or agency responsible for the overall coordination of international technical assistance) and should be submitted ONLY through the diplomatic channel via Embassy of Malaysia in the respective countries.

Only successful applicants will be notified.

TARGET PARTICIPANTS

This Course is relevant for middle to senior level official from the Environmental Protection Agency of all MTCP Recipient Countries.

Education and Working Experience

Applicants must:

- i. possess at least a Diploma in the field of sciences or engineering and proficient in English. ii. have at least 1-year practical experience in environmental management and pollution control

FELLOWSHIP / SCHOLARSHIP

Terms and conditions of scholarship / fellowship awards under the MTCP at EIMAS include:

Food and Lodging

Food and lodging will be provided for the duration of the course. Participants are not allowed to bring any family members during the course.

Air Fares

A return flight ticket from the capital city of the recipient country to Kuala Lumpur on economy class is provided for participants. Please refer to the MTCP website for further details.

Course Fees

All course fees are borne by the Government of Malaysia.

Medical and Dental Treatment

Candidates should be certified medically and physically fit to participate in this programme. During participants' stay in Malaysia, all medical and dental expenses in government hospital / clinic are at the cost of the Malaysian Government. Dental treatment however is restricted to extraction and filling only which must be carried out in government hospitals / clinics only.

Visa and Vaccination

It is mandatory for all the MTCP participants to follow the Visa With Reference (VWR) application procedure. Once the approval is obtained, the training institution should send a copy of VDR approval letter to the participants. Subsequently, with the copy of the approval, the participants may get the VDR from the nearest Embassy of Malaysia. Wherever applicable, participants are advised to arrange for vaccination on their own prior to travel to Malaysia.

Expenditures on all visa-related fees, airport tax/airport user's charge, transit insurance, excess

luggage, travel tax, transit fees, domestic passenger terminal fees, phone charges, private purchases, etc borne by the participants. This also applies for vaccination before travel to Malaysia.

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF AWARD

Participants shall conduct themselves at all times in a manner compatible with their responsibilities as MTCP scholarship holders and abide by the laws, rules and regulations of EIMAS.

The award may be terminated at any time due to unsatisfactory conduct, breach of the conditions of the award, failure to make satisfactory progress or as deemed necessary by the Malaysian training institution.

Participants are not allowed to participate in any political and/or commercial activities in any capacity whatsoever. Participants shall not take up paid employment during the tenure of their scholarship or serve on the staff of their Official Representatives in Malaysia.

Participants are NOT allowed to bring along their spouses or families for the duration of the course. Participants are NOT allowed to plan for their own vacation or go to other destinations during the course duration without prior approval from the training institution. Participants will be required to return to their own countries upon completion of the course or at the end of the tenure of the scholarship, whichever is earlier.
