MALAYSIAN TECHNICAL COOPERATION program

MTCP was officially launched on 7 September 1980 at the Commonwealth Heads of State Meeting in New Delhi to signify Malaysia's commitment to South-South Cooperation, in particular to share its development experiences and expertise with other developing countries. Based on the belief that the development of a country depends on the quality of its human resources, MTCP emphasizes the development of human resources through the provision of training in various areas which are essential for a country's development such as public administration, good governance, health services, education, sustainable development, agriculture, poverty alleviation, investment promotion, ICT and banking. Annually, more than 100 MTCP Programmes are offered by approximately 79 MTCP training institutions/agencies, many of which are centers of excellence for training. Since its inception, MTCP has gained more than 30,600 participants from 141 countries.

OBJECTIVES OF MTCP

- To share development experience with other countries;
- To strengthen bilateral relations between Malaysia and other developing countries;
- To promote South-South Cooperation (SSC); and
- To promote technical cooperation among developing countries (TCDC).

TRAINING ON MANAGING SAFETY IN TRANSPORT INDUSTRY

Road Traffic Safety (RTS) is a global concern. It is estimated that around 1.3 million people are killed and 20 million to 50 million are injured on roads around the world each year, and that this level is rising. The socio economic and health impacts are substantial.

This ISO 39001 provides a tool to help organization reduce, and ultimately eliminate, the incidence and risk of death and serious injury related to road traffic crashes. This focus can result in a more cost effective use of the road traffic system.

RTS ISO 39001 is applicable to public and private organizations that interact with the road traffic system. It can be used by internal and external parties, including certification bodies, to assess the organization's ability to meet the requirements.

Experience around the world has shown that large reductions in death and serious injury can be achieved through the adoption of a holistic Safe System approach to RTS.

Objectives Training

The objective of this training program is to assist agencies related in promoting RTS in the developing countries to help in controlling the disasters caused by road traffic incidence.

Course Content

Participants will be exposed with the knowledge, technique, standards and method of implementation and technique in developing and setting the RTS management system for their own organization. Participants will also be trained on how to use all the risk analysis tools and improvement method to ensure the effectiveness of RTS management system developed.

Course Methodology

Lectures, workshop, case study and group discussion will be conducted in between the session and Industrial Visit.

Criteria of Applicant

This training program is developed for intermediaries with the mandate to assist their governments in promoting RTS in their respective countries. Local Authorities, Safety officers, Top Management, Head of Department, Traffic Implementer and staffs from organization directly involved in Road Traffic activities are strongly encouraged to attend the program.

HOW TO APPLY

Application should be made using the prescribed MTCP forms available at

- Copy of Passport
- Passport size colored photo (3.5cm x 5 cm)
- Medical Report

6. TOEFL/IELTS certificates

10. Endorsement from the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of your country

TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Visa and Vaccination

All participants are required to enter Malaysia with Visa with Reference (VDR). Once the approval is obtained, the training institutions should send a copy of letter of approval to the participants. Subsequently, with the copy of the approval, the participants may get the VDR from the nearest Malaysian Missions. Wherever applicable, participants are advised to arrange on their own for vaccination prior to travel to Malaysia

Expenditures on all visa-related fees, airport tax/airport user's charge, transit insurance, excess luggage, travel tax, transit fees, domestic passenger terminal fees, phone charges, private purchases, etc. are borne by the recipients. It also applies for vaccination before travel to Malaysia.

Course Fee

All course fees are borne by the Government of Malaysia.

Accommodation and Meals

Accommodation and food are provided. Participants are not allowed to change any arrangement done by the respective training institution.

Fares

A return air ticket from the capital city of the recipient country to Kuala Lumpur on economy class is provided for participants from countries which their GDP per capita is below USD5,000. However, some countries need to bear their own air fares.

Medical Treatment

Candidates should be certified medically and physically fit to participate in this program. In the case of emergencies and in need of medical treatment, the medical expenses in a government hospital will be borne by the Government of Malaysia. In case of admission in government hospitals, participants will be eligible for first class wards (two bedded or more). However in private clinic or Medical Centre the medical expenses is on participant's own liability.

GENERAL CONDITIONS OF AWARD

Participants shall conduct themselves at all times in a manner compatible with their responsibilities as MTCP scholarship holders and abide by the laws, rules and regulations of SIRIM.

This scholarship cannot be held concurrently with any other scholarship awards. Participants shall follow the program approved for them. Request for change of program will not be entertained. Participants should fully participate in all activities related to the program.

Participants are NOT allowed to participate in any political and/or commercial activities in any capacity whatsoever. Participants shall not take up paid employment during the tenure of their scholarship or serve as the staff of their Diplomatic Missions in Malaysia.

Participants are NOT allowed to bring along their spouses or families for the duration of the course. Participants are NOT allowed to leave Malaysia during the course. Participants who are found to be medically unfit during the course of the program will be required to return to their country. Participants are NOT allowed to bring, consume or distribute liquor / alcoholic, drugs or human to Malaysia. Participants are NOT allowed to perform public naked, hugging and kissing between male and female, lap dancing or any erotic actions, sexual harassment and prostitution. Participants are NOT allowed to perform or participate in any dangerous and / or illegal activities such as stealing hotel belongings. Participants are NOT allowed to plan for own vacation or going to other destinations without training institution's approval.

Participants shall abide by the terms and conditions of the MTCP.

TERMINATION

The award may be terminated at any time due to unsatisfactory conduct, breach of the conditions of the award, failure to make satisfactory progress or as deemed necessary by SIRIM Berhad with the approval of the MTCP Secretariat.
