

About Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP)

The Malaysian Technical Cooperation Programme (MTCP) was officially launched on 7 September 1980 at the Commonwealth Heads of State Meeting in New Delhi to signify Malaysia's commitment to South-South Cooperation, in particular Technical Cooperation among Developing Countries (TCDC).

The programme forms part of the commitment of the Malaysian Government towards the promotion of technical cooperation among developing countries, strengthening of regional and sub-regional cooperation, as well as nurturing collective self-reliance among developing countries.

Annually, more than 100 MTCP programmes are offered by 79 MTCP training institutions, many of which are centres of excellence for training. Since its inception, MTCP has gained more than 30,600 participants from 141 countries which have benefited from the various programmes offered.

MTCP Objectives

- To share Malaysia's development experience with other countries.
- To strengthen bilateral relations between Malaysia and other developing countries.
- To promote South-South Cooperation (SSC)
- To promote Technical Cooperation among Developing Countries (TCDC).

About National Audit Academy (NAA)

The National Audit Academy was established as a development project of the National Audit Department under the 8th Malaysia Plan. The construction was completed on 26 July 2005 and inaugurated in November 2005. NAA is situated at Bandar Enstek, Negeri Sembilan.

The NAA is about 55 kilometres from The National Audit Department Headquarters in Putrajaya and 10 kilometres from the Kuala Lumpur International Airport (KLIA). The Academy occupies an area of 20 acres.

The National Audit Department envisages the Academy to be utilized as a platform for enhancing professionalism in public sector auditing. It is entrusted with the responsibility to upgrade and enhance the auditing knowledge, skills and attitude of the auditors through systematic and planned training programmes. It takes into account the requirement for the current training needs and to be prepared for future challenges.

In addition, it also serves to promote awareness within the public sector on the importance of public accountability through courses offered in the fields of auditing, accounting, information and communication technology and management.

- Good working knowledge of both spoken and written English since the group requires active participation in group discussion, group & individual exercises.

- Members of **Supreme Audit Institution (SAI)**

- Application should be made using the prescribed MTCP forms available at :

- The application must be completed and endorsed by the Ministry of Foreign Affairs/Focal Points responsible for the MTCP Programme in the applicant's country, then submitted through the applicant's government to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs Malaysia, via a Note Verbale from the applicant's Ministry of Foreign Affairs.
- It is mandatory for all the MTCP/TCTP participants to follow Visa With Reference (VWR) application procedure before leaving their respective countries.

Preparation of Country Paper

- Successful applicants will be required to prepare a country paper describing the Performance Audit programmes and plans in his/her country in general and the role of his/her organization in particular.
- A 10 minute presentation (PowerPoint) will be required from each country during the programme.
- The country paper should cover the following topics :
 - Brief Introduction of SAI Office
 - Relating the conduct of performance audit based on country's experience
 - Challenges in Performance Auditing (if any)
 - Audit Activities Undertaken by SAI Office
 - Participants Expectations From This Programme

Other Information

- Please ensure that you have a valid international passport (**6 months**) and visa requirements are in order.
- Please bring enough money to cover your initial expenses on departure from your home country, as allowances will only be paid after your arrival in Malaysia.
- Expenditures on any related fees, airport tax, transit insurance, excess luggage, travel tax, transit fees, domestic passenger terminal fees, phone charges, etc. are to be borne by the participants.
